# ABOUT ART HARVEST

Founded in 1964 as a modest sidewalk art show at the Dunedin Marina, Art Harvest has grown into the largest and most anticipated autumn art festival in the Tampa Bay area. What began as a grassroots effort by a group of dedicated Junior League volunteers has blossomed into a beloved annual tradition that brings together artists, families, collectors, and community members from across the region and beyond.

Held on the first weekend in November at Highlander Park in Dunedin, Art Harvest is a juried fine arts show that now features over 200 accomplished artists from around the country. Spanning a wide array of media, including painting, ceramics, jewelry, woodworking, photography, mixed media, and fibers, the event offers something for every taste and budget. Art Harvest provides artists with a dynamic platform to showcase and sell their work while engaging directly with thousands of art lovers and patrons.

But Art Harvest is more than just an art show; it's a community celebration and a key fundraiser for the Junior League of Clearwater-Dunedin (JLCD). Over its six-decade history, the event has helped raise critical funds to support JLCD's mission-driven work in Northern Pinellas County.

This diverse organization welcomes and celebrates women of all backgrounds, as each Member brings a unique perspective to our organization and enriches our League.

## OUR HISTORY

Since 1948, dynamic women have committed themselves to improving the lives of women and children in Northern Pinellas County. In 1986, the Junior League of Clearwater merged with the Junior Service League of Dunedin to form the Junior League of Clearwater-Dunedin.

With over 650 Members having contributed more than 1 million volunteer hours and raised over \$1 million since our founding, our League is rooted in legacy, fueled by passion, and driven by a vision for a stronger, healthier community.



# OUR IMPACT

In 2025, JLCD selected mental well-being as its new community focus area. We are partnering with organizations such as the **Clearwater Free Clinic** to promote mental health, self-esteem, and wellness to residents in our community.

This focus strengthens our investment in developing our Members as strong, effective leaders who are equipped to drive lasting impact in our community. It also reinforces our commitment to creating a supportive environment where Members care for one another, not just as volunteers, but as women navigating life's challenges together. Together, through grassroots action and collective leadership, we're creating space for women to lead their best lives - locally and beyond.



## LEGACY PROJECTS

JLCD has a long history of creating and sustaining initiatives that have become pillars in our community. Our legacy projects include:

- **1956: Play Parc** – A center for children with intellectual and developmental disabilities.
- **1974: Dunedin Fine Arts Center** – Founded by five Junior League Members to create a space for art and cultural enrichment.
- **1976: Heritage Park** – Developed by JLCD and later entrusted to the Pinellas County Parks Department.
- **The Marine Science Center** – Was the West Coast's largest facility for rescue, treatment, and research for marine life.
- **Time Out Homes** – A pioneering child abuse prevention program.
- **Morton Plant Hospital Birthing Room & Speech Clinic** – Projects supporting maternal health and child development.
- **Sunshine Playground in Clearwater** – A beloved community play space.

## RECENT COMMUNITY PROJECTS

JLCD has supported a range of impactful initiatives, including:

- **Calvin's Closet:** Year-round clothing, hygiene, and snack support for students at Calvin Hunsinger School.
- **Cops 'N Kids:** Hygiene kits and books for youth in a free after-school program.
- **Disaster Relief:** Hosted events for displaced children and aided park cleanup after hurricanes.
- **Backpack Drive:** Provided 300+ backpacks filled with school supplies.
- **Hope Villages:** Donated self-care bags, food pantry support, and holiday gifts for families in need.
- **Feed the Fosters:** Supplied Thanksgiving meals to 18 foster families.
- **HEP Garden:** Assisted with upkeep of the Homeless Empowerment Project's food garden.

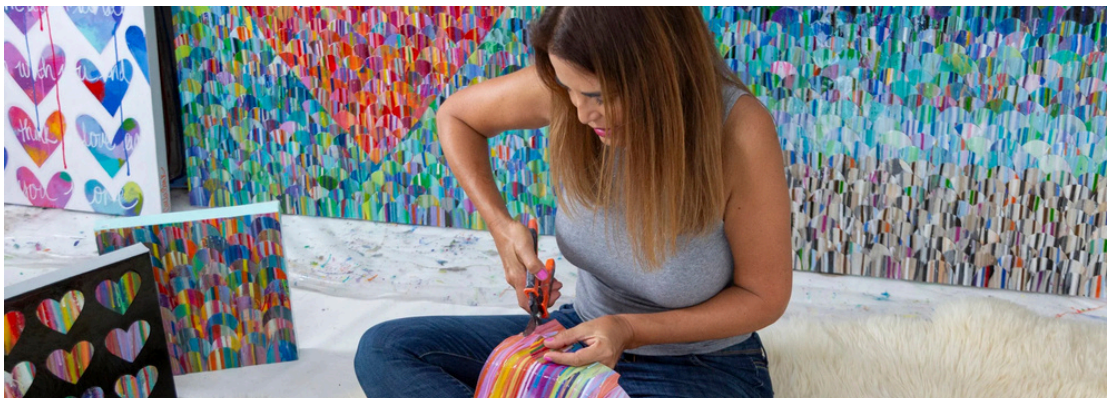
## Carla Bank

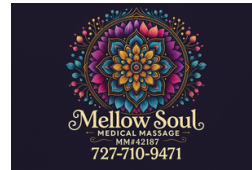

# ART HARVEST JUDGES

## ■ DANNY OLDA

Danny Olda is an art critic, editor, and curator based in Florida, USA. His writing has been featured in several national and international publications such as Hyperallergic, Art Papers, Artillery Magazine, Momus, Temporary Art Review, BurnAway, Daily Serving, Hi-Fructose Magazine, Beautiful/Decay, Eutopia, Art Radar, Creative Loafing, and Sarasota Visual Art.

He has also curated exhibitions, lectured, and served on grant panels for private galleries, nonprofit spaces, museums, and colleges and universities. Danny was born in New York City and currently lives and works on Florida's Gulf Coast. He has served as the curator for the Gallery at Creative Pinellas and the Woodson African American Museum of Florida and is currently the curator at the Dunedin Fine Art Center.



## ■ MICHELE TUEGEL

Michele Tuegel is an accomplished artist, curator, and arts advocate. She owned Michele Tuegel Contemporary, a downtown St. Petersburg gallery (2012-2016) showcasing local and national artists. Previously, she served as Media Relations and Arts Specialist for Pinellas County Cultural Affairs and was the founding Executive Director of Florida Craftsmen, Inc. (now Florida CraftArt). A graduate of the University of South Florida with a BA and MFA in Printmaking and Papermaking, she received a State of Florida Individual Artist Fellowship and studied at Dieu Donne Paper Mill in New York City.

Tuegel has exhibited in more than 100 solo and group shows, including at the Smithsonian Institution and USA TODAY Headquarters. Her work is represented in museum, corporate, and private collections. She has curated national exhibitions, served on the American Craft Council SE board, and continues to jury festivals, mentor artists, and lecture on contemporary art and fine craft. In retirement, she studies ceramics at St. Petersburg College under professors McKenzie Smith and Kim Kirchman.



## ■ JONATHAN BARNES

Jonathan Barnes was born in Kissimmee, Florida, and spent his early years sailing the coasts of Florida and the Caribbean with his parents. He earned his BA in Graphic Design from the University of Central Florida in 2002 but soon discovered that working with clay was far more fulfilling. This passion led him to pursue an MFA in Ceramics at the University of Mississippi, where he also participated in a study abroad program in Shigaraki, Japan, through the University of Georgia, and exhibited in numerous national juried and invitational shows. After completing his MFA, Jonathan returned to Florida as a resident artist at the St. Petersburg Clay Company. He later joined St. Petersburg College, becoming Academic Department Chair of Fine Arts and Humanities at the Clearwater Campus in 2012. In 2023, he returned to teaching Ceramics, Printmaking, and Art Appreciation while maintaining an active studio practice. A member of the Tampa Tour de Clay group, Jonathan lives and works in Clearwater, where he continues to create from his home studio.



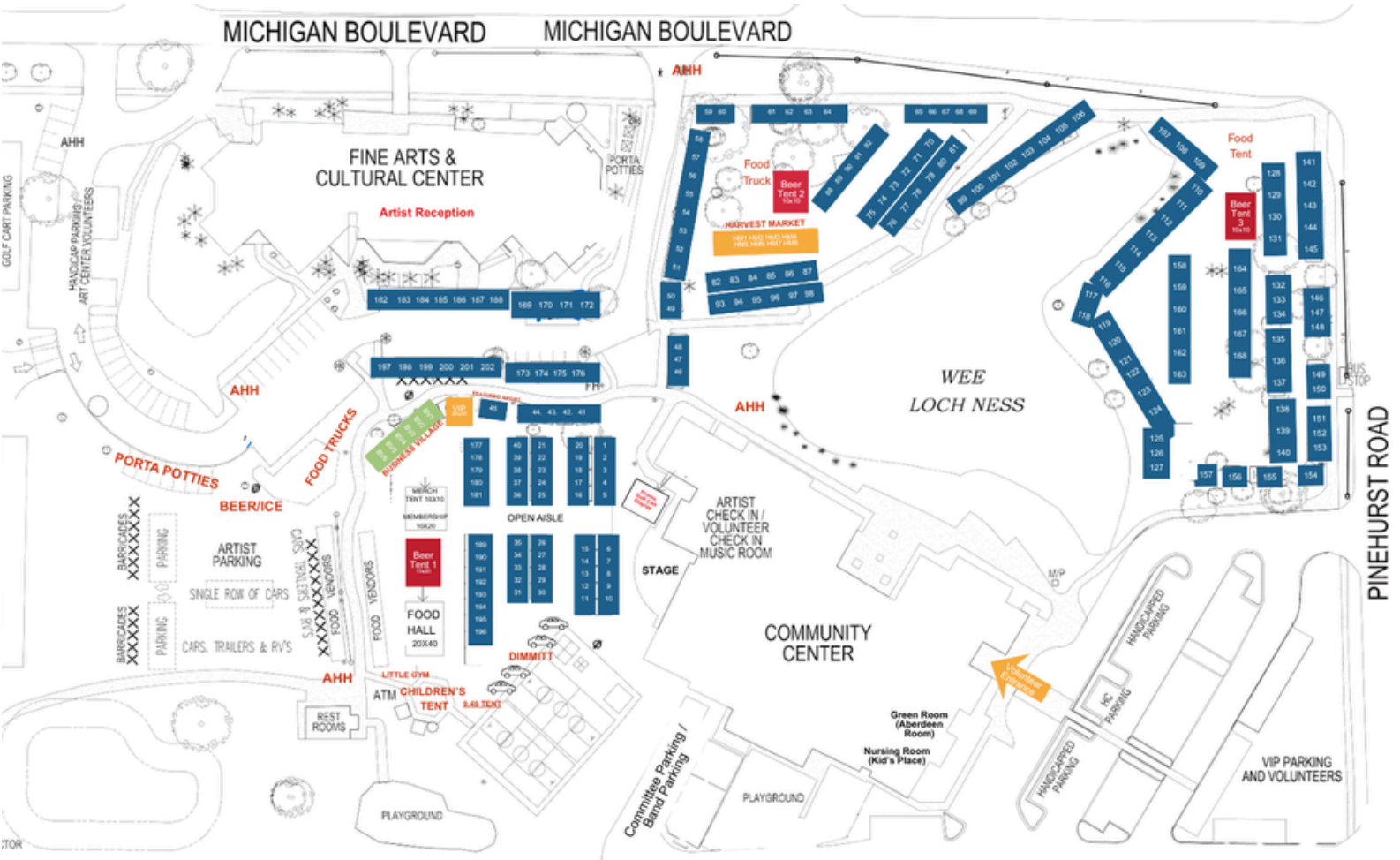

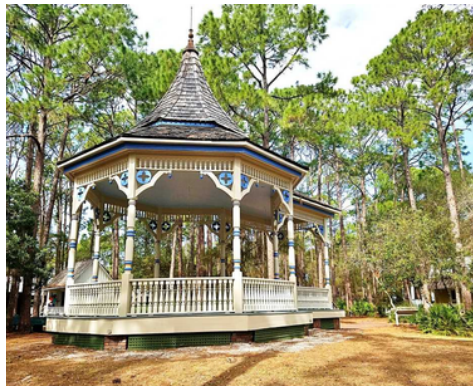
